Subject: Petition regarding the violent attack on the ST–SC–OBC community gathering in Jabalpur, desecration of the Constitution of India, police misconduct and bias, intimidation of constitution alliterature vendors, threats issued by RSS–VHP–Bajrang Dal workers, the possibility of organised riots, and a request for strict directions to the DGP, Madhya Pradesh.

Respected Sir,

I hereby submit this detailed petition regarding the violent and unlawful attack that occurred on 23 November 2025 at a peaceful ST–SC–OBC community conference held in Jabalpur, and the subsequent misconduct, negligence and partisan behaviour displayed by the local police authorities.

I belong to the Other Backward Classes (OBC) community, and the programme in question was a united conference of the ST, SC and OBC communities, conducted with the purpose of spreading constitutional values, social justice and equality. The incident has therefore directly affected members of my community as well.

1. Peaceful nature of the ST–SC–OBC gathering .

The programme was entirely peaceful, aiming at awareness, equality and constitutional respect. There was no provocation or unlawful activity of any kind from the participants.

2. Violence initiated by identifiable local RSS–VHP–Bajrang Dal workers.

The attack was not carried out by unknown outsiders but by clearly identifiable local workers belonging to RSS, VHP and Bajrang Dal. If they had any genuine objection to any book, literature or content displayed at the programme, the lawful course of action available to them was:

- (a) filing a complaint with the police,
- (b) allowing an official investigation, and
- (c) pursuing any grievance through due judicial process.

However, these individuals chose to ignore all legal remedies and instead unlawfully mobilised a mob and initiated violence, including physical assault, vandalism and disruption. This constitutes a premeditated, organised and deliberate criminal initiation.

3. Physical assault on ST–SC–OBC participants.

Members of all three communities were beaten, abused and threatened. Panic and chaos forced many to flee the venue in fear.

4. Desecration of the Constitution of India.

Copies of the Constitution of India were torn and desecrated. This is a direct attack on the democratic spirit of the nation and is punishable under BNS 2023 and the SC/ST Prevention of Atrocities Act.

5. Attack on victims near Omti Police Station the next day.

When ST–SC–OBC victims approached the police the following day to lodge a complaint, workers of RSS–VHP and Bajrang Dal again attacked them near Omti Police Station. The police merely made a symbolic attempt to restrain them, without deploying adequate force, thereby enabling the attackers to continue without consequence.

6. Video evidence.

Clear video footage exists showing police bias and failure to restrain the aggressors.

7. Illegal conduct of the Station House Officer, Madan Mahal.

The TI of Madan Mahal Police Station demanded a “license” from vendors selling copies of the Constitution of India. Selling or distributing the Constitution requires no license whatsoever. The officer’s action was unconstitutional, oppressive and an abuse of power.

8. Threats issued on social media.

Several individuals associated with RSS–VHP–Bajrang Dal have issued threats on Facebook and Instagram, including caste-based insults, intimidation and violent messages. These constitute offences under the SC/ST Act, BNS 2023 and the IT Act. All screenshots have been preserved and will be submitted upon request.

9. Possibility of imminent communal violence.

Local intelligence, social media patterns and ground-level behaviour indicate the clear possibility of organised riots or targeted violence in the near future. Immediate preventive action is required.

10. Need for deployment of RAF.

In view of the rising tension and credible threat of violence, deployment of the Riot Action Force (RAF) or equivalent anti-riot units in sensitive areas of Jabalpur is urgently necessary.

11. Immediate suspension of the Madan Mahal TI.

His conduct has been biased, unlawful and in violation of constitutional obligations. Immediate suspension is necessary to ensure a fair and impartial investigation. 12. Directions to the DGP, Madhya Pradesh
Strict instructions must be issued to the DGP to ensure impartial investigation, restore security, prevent further violence, take disciplinary action against delinquent officers, and monitor the matter personally.

13. Matter to be communicated to NCBC

Since the incident has directly affected the OBC community as well, it is essential that the National Commission for Backward Classes (NCBC) be informed and requested to take cognizance of the matter.

Therefore, I respectfully request the Hon’ble Commissions to:

- Order a high-level impartial investigation.
- Ensure strict legal action against the attackers.
- Suspend the Madan Mahal TI.

- Issue urgent directions to the DGP.
- Deploy RAF in sensitive zones.
- Register FIRs against all social media threats.
- Communicate the matter to NCBC.
