Subject: Concerning the serious allegations related to the suicide of RSS volunteer Anandu Aji from Kerala following sexual harassment and mental torture, the list of minor members, registration status of the organisation, and child protection measures.

Respected Sir/Madam,

With due respect, it is submitted that after the suicide of RSS volunteer *Anandu Aji* in Kerala, serious criminal allegations have emerged against several senior RSS officials and Pracharaks in the state, including mental harassment, sexual assault (rape), and murder. A fair, prompt, and effective investigation is urgently required.

Request for Action

1. A detailed inquiry should be conducted into the incident and an FIR should be registered under the provisions of the POCSO Act, sections relating to mental harassment, rape, and murder to ensure justice for the victim.
2. The National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR) should be directed to obtain from the relevant ministry/department of the Government of India, a complete list of all RSS volunteers below 18 years of age across the country, and to facilitate psychological counselling for them. This is necessary to guarantee their safety and prevent other children from becoming victims of similar abuse.
3. As the NCPCR is responsible for child protection, children below 18 years of age should be prohibited from attending RSS shakhas, path sanchalans, and training camps or becoming members of the organisation.
4. The Government of India should clarify under which Ministry or Department the RSS organisation is registered; whether there exists an official record of its membership registration, office-bearer list, list of volunteers below 18 years, and lists of participants in *path sanchalans and training camps.
If such records are unavailable with any government authority, a national-level inquiry committee should be constituted to investigate this matter and take appropriate action against responsible officials.
5. In several path sanchalans and training programs, minor children (volunteers) are seen handling sticks and lathis. This poses a potential threat to LAW IN ORDER and National Security. Thus, the Government of India must ensure that details of registration, membership, and financial transactions of the RSS organisation are maintained under constitutional accountability.
6. The registration of RSS should mandatorily be done under applicable Indian laws such as the Societies Registration Act, the Indian Trusts Act,* or the *Companies Act*. Such legal registration is essential for transparency regarding its members and activities.

7. In this regard, I also request the *Ministry of Home Affairs* and the *Ministry of Law and Justice* to provide official information regarding the membership registration and lists of RSS members.

Prayer

You are requested to take immediate and appropriate action in this serious matter to ensure justice for the victims, protection of children, and proper legal registration and regulation of the organisation.
